Recommended MBA Project Report Structure

A standard MBA project report should present the topic clearly, explain the research method, show data analysis and end with practical findings and suggestions. This format can be adjusted as per university requirements.

Chapter	Recommended Content
1. Introduction	Background, industry context, problem statement, need and significance of study
2. Objectives and Scope	Research objectives, scope, limitations and expected contribution
3. Literature Review / Theoretical Framework	Concepts, theories, previous studies and variables
4. Research Methodology	Research design, sample size, sampling method, tools and data sources
5. Data Analysis and Interpretation	Tables, charts, graphs, observations and interpretation
6. Findings and Suggestions	Major findings, recommendations and practical implications
7. Conclusion	Summary, learning and final conclusion
Annexures	Questionnaire, references, certificates, list of tables and figures

Formatting Checklist

- Use Times New Roman or university-specified font.
- Keep headings consistent across all chapters.
- Add page numbers, table numbers and figure numbers.
- Use clear tables, charts and interpretation below each graph.
- Add references in APA or university-specified style.

Common Mistakes to Avoid

- Do not submit a report without checking university format.
- Do not keep copied content without rewriting and referencing.
- Do not add charts without interpretation.
- Do not ignore guide feedback and correction comments.
- Do not prepare PPT at the last minute.
